RESOLUTION NO. 2011-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE DILLINGHAM CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO AWARD THE PURCHASE OF A USED 2002 SEPTIC PUMPER TRUCK FOR THE EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN FOR THE SNAG POINT SEWER LINE

WHEREAS, it is necessary to purchase a septic pumper truck as outlined in Resolution No. 2011-02, Requesting Use of BBEDC FY11 Community Block Grant Funds to Purchase a Septic Pumper Truck for the Emergency Response Plan for the Snag Point Sewer line, and Resolution No. 2011-03, Authorizing the City Manager to Waive the Advertising Requirements to Award the Purchase of a Septic Pumper Truck for the Emergency Response Plan for the Snag Point sewer Line;

WHEREAS, a septic pumper truck was not budgeted in the Equipment Replacement Capital Project Fund Budget Items for FY 2011; and,

WHEREAS, funding for a septic pumper truck could be made possible from an existing BBEDC Community Block Grant contingent upon approval of a reassignment of funds to this item; and

WHEREAS, Dillingham Municipal Code (DMC) 4.30.130, Exemptions, Section B., allows exemptions to the purchasing restrictions if the City Council determines that the public interest would be best served by waiving the procedures, and that such determination must be made in the form of a resolution adopted prior to the proposed action; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of a septic pumper truck at this time would be considered an emergency need;

WHEREAS, staff contacted the firm of Sterling and Western Star, Anchorage, Alaska, to help with a search for a septic pumper truck, and one was located in the State, in the City of Wasilla; and

WHEREAS, it will take several trips to move the vehicle to Dillingham via air, because it will need to be disassembled to fit in the plane and reassembled in Dillingham;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council approves the purchase of a used Septic Pumper Truck from Sterling and Western Star in the amount of \$73,500, plus the cost of freight with Lynden Air Freight for an estimated quote of \$33,000, for a total estimated cost of \$108,500.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the purchase of the septic pumper truck would be made with a BBEDC Community Block Grant contingent upon their approval of a reassignment of funding dollars.

PASSED and ADOPTED by the Dillingham City Council on January 6, 2011.


