INFORMATION ON ABSENTEE VOTING
REGULAR CITY ELECTION: OCTOBER 3, 2023

If you are going to be unavoidably absent from town on Election Day, you can vote as absentee.

ABSENTEE VOTING IN PERSON DMC 3.50.050

You can vote in person prior to Election Day, October 3, 2023, at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, beginning on Monday, September 18, 2023, through Monday, October 2, 2023. Please call 842-5212 to make an appointment, office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL DMC 3.50.070

If you are voting by mail, you must apply for an Absentee Voting Ballot Request by Mail form. To receive a ballot, this application **MUST be postmarked by September 23, 2023**, ten (10) days before the election. A ballot request form may be submitted by fax to (907) 842-2060.

Each person requesting an absentee ballot must personally sign their request. Please complete your absentee ballot request carefully and return it to the City Clerk's Office promptly to allow time for processing. An incomplete request or a mail delay could prevent you from receiving your ballot on time. If after you submit your request, your physical or mailing address changes, contact the City Clerk's Office immediately. Ballots will NOT be forwarded if they are returned as undeliverable.

Absentee balloting material, including instructions, will be mailed to you approximately two weeks prior to the election. To be counted, your ballot, **MUST BE VOTED, POSTMARKED, AND MAILED** to the City Clerk no later than Election Day and must be received before the date and hour of the canvass, **October 5, 2023, by noon.**

ABSENTEE VOTING BY PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE DMC 3.50.060

If you are a qualified voter with a language barrier or physically disabled, you may apply for an absentee ballot through a personal representative, to the City Clerk, at City Hall, **September 18, 2023 through October 3, 2023.**

Upon receipt of a written application by the personal representative, the election official authorized to issue the absentee ballot shall provide the ballot and other absentee voting material to the personal representative if the written application is signed by the applicant and is accompanied by a letter from a licensed physician, or a statement signed by two qualified voters stating that the applicant will be unable to go to the polling place because of physical disability.
