In response to comments received from LBC staff the draft notice was revised. (note that the publication was changed slightly between August 14 and August 21 to add additional parties.) A copy of the notice, "Supplemental Notice of a Pre-Submission Public Hearing for a Petition for Legislative Review of an Annexation to the City of Dillingham", as it appeared is Attachment 3, and the affidavit of publication is Attachment 4.

The public notice ("Supplemental Notice of a Pre-Submission Public Hearing for a Petition for Legislative Review of an Annexation to the City of Dillingham") was hand-delivered to the Native Village of Ekuk. This, and a copy of the Proof of Delivery signed by Nancy S. Larsen on August 12, 2014, for Ekuk Village Council, is Attachment 5.

The public notice was also posted on the City of Dillingham web site beginning August 12, 2014.

The City submitted a request for a public service announcement of the hearing notice to Radio Station KDLG on August 21, 2014, and asked that it be announced during the 21 days preceding the pre-filing public hearing. This is Attachment 6. A similar request was made not made to a local cable television provider as there is no local cable TV station in Dillingham.

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE DILLINGHAM CITY COUNCIL APPROVING A DRAFT PETITION TO ANNEX THE NUSHAGAK COMMERICAL SALMON DISTRICT AND THE WOOD RIVER SOCKEYE SALMON SPECIAL HARVEST AREA BY THE LEGISLATIVE REVIEW METHOD

WHEREAS, the City's annexation of the Nushagak Commercial Salmon District, and, the Wood River Sockeye Salmon Special Harvest area was remanded by the court to process the petition through the legislative review method, and

WHEREAS, the City feels the annexation is important in order for the City to continue to provide services to the commercial fishing industry and surrounding communities on a sustainable basis; and

WHEREAS, the original petition approved by the Local Boundary Commission has been updated by staff, attorney and consultant into a draft document for presentation to the public at a hearing dated September 24, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the draft petition needs City Council approval prior to presenting to the public; and

WHEREAS, once the draft petition is approved by the City Council it will be made available to the public by being posted on the City's website, being placed in public places and being placed in city offices; and

WHEREAS, a notice announcing the hearing on September 24, 2014 as well as where a copy of the draft petition can be obtained will be given to the local radio station and published in a local newspaper as required by the Local Boundary Commission; and

WHEREAS, changes to the draft petition may be made following the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, additional City Council authorization will be necessary before the City is authorized to submit the annexation petition to the Local Boundary Commission for approval;

# Feds charge plant employee for covering up emission violations

office

Federal prosecutors in Alaska have charged a previously unnamed Dutch Harbor seafood plant employee with a Clean Air Act violation, stemming from allegations he falsified emissions forms that were then used unwittingly by his employer.

Raul Morales faces a single charge for violating the federal law that regulates air pol-lutant emissions. The government filed a plea agreement on Tuesday. Morales is set to enter his plea on Aug. 21. He faces up to two years in prison and a \$500,000 fine.

Morales worked as the powerhouse supervisor at Westward Seafood Inc's Dutch Harbor facility. The company is a subsidiary of Japan-based Maruha-Nichiro Holdings Inc., which maintains a headquarters in Seattle. It processes 254 million pounds of seafood each year.

The plant produces its own electricity with three diesel-fueled generators, as well as steam for fish production using two diesel-fired steam generators. Westward holds a Clean Air Act permit, which requires the use of systems that saturate the air, decreasing the nitrogen dioxide emissions dis-charging through the plant's single smoke-stack, according to the plea agreement.

Those emissions-cutting systems were scarcely in use from August 2009 to August 2011, according to the charges against two men. Former Westward employee Bryan Beigh crafted a makeshift tool to make the dials on the systems' water gauges spin in an attempt to cover up the disuse.

In the charges against Beigh filed last week, an unnamed supervisor conspired with Beigh to falsify the gauges' readings on paperwork. Now the government has outlined how Morales allegedly duped Westward's environmental compliance Beigh has agreed to plead guilty, accord-ing to federal prosecutor Kevin Feldis. He monitored and repaired equipment in ihe powerhouse.

As powerhouse supervisor, Morales was responsible for all aspects of the engine room, including the generators, the plea agreement says. Part of the job required reports that measured the saturation sys tems' water use.

Instead of properly filling out reports, "Defendant Morales used a preprinted sheet which he would consult to determine, based on how long the engine had been operating on any particular day, how much water the (systems) would have used had it been in operation," the plea agreement says.

The false information about water usage "was unwittingly used for Westward's semi-annual operating reports and annual compliance certifications," the plea agreement says, adding there appeared to be no deviations from permit requirements when, in fact, "there were gross violations." Westward said in a prepared statement

that the company first uncovered the illegal acts of Beigh and "other rogue employees" in September 2011. The employees were immediately fired and federal authorities were contacted, according to the statement.

"We have a zero-tolerance policy for any behavior of this nature," said Westward President Rick Dutton. "The charged ex-employee, and others who participated in the others of characteristic dependence of the same second behavior of the same second secon this scheme, fabricated documents, lied to their supervisors, and acted in a manner that is entirely contrary to the company's values and policies. We have redoubled our compliance efforts to ensure that this will never happen again."

# Odds of infant death higher in remote villages, research shows

Alaska Native babies in small, remote villages die at twice the rate of Native infants in cilies, according to new research from the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium.

Sleeping in same beds as people or pets.
Caregivers who are very tired or under

the influence of alcohol and drugs. The number of babies dying before 12 months of age has long been a public health concern in Alaska. The mortality rate for all Alaska infants ranks about in the middle of all states and has dropped sharply since 1980. Among Alaska Natives, however, the rate

of 9.2 deaths per 1,000 live births remains roughly 50 percent higher than the national average. Native infant death figures leveled off and possibly increased slightly between 2006 and 2010, the most recent period studied The research identified the child's hometown based on the mother's residence listed on birth certificates.

A mother's health, access to quality medi-cal care and poverty all influence the child's chances of survival. The Tribal Health Consortium research compared infant death rates in villages that are accessible only by boat or plane to cities and hubs with

regional hospitals. "We observed an 80 percent increase in the odds of death for infants whose mother's residence was reached by air or boat compared with those whose mothers lived on the road system," Britton wrole in a presentation prepared for the conference. The mother's hometown did not significantly affect survival rates for non-Native infants, the research found.

The precise causes of the disparity in urban and rural and Alaska Native and non-Native death rates is unclear. "It could be any number of things and we

# New boats arrive for Bristol Bay VPSOs

Fifteen new boats have been purchased for use by Village Public Safety Officers in the Bristol Bay region, courtesy of a \$\$82,054 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice. The Public Safety and Community Policing (COPS) grant was awarded to the Bristol Bay Native Association, which oversees the area's VPSO program.

area's VPSO program. "I think our folks are really going to appreciate these new boats, and I think they represent a major improvement over our current equipment," said Carla Akelkok, who manages the VPSO program for BBNA. She said several villages do not currently have any boats for use by the VPSO.

The 18' Lund Alaska skiffs are outfitted to the hilt. Features include an open bow, rugged flooring, four pedestal chairs, new curved windshields and eventual canopy top. The skiffs are powered by a locallyfavored new four-stroke 70 horsepower Yamaha motor, and come with a heavyduty trailer. All 15 boat, motor, and trailer packages were purchased through L&M Supplies in Dillingham, and have turned more than few heads as they are assembled in the parking lot.

Akelkok says the boats will be delivered to the village as soon as possible. Some may arrive this fall, but a few that will need to be barged to the village may be delayed till next spring. "We believe these boats will be an impor-

"We believe these boats will be an important asset as our VPSOs, who are our first responders, assist in various emergencies, search and rescues, and river patrols between villages," she said.

The villages set to receive the new boats are Aleknagik, Ekwok, New Stuyahok, Koliganek, Igiugig, Levelock, New Halen, Kokhanok, Pilot Point, Port Heiden, Chignik Bay, Manokotak, and Togiak. Akelkok said details are still being arranged to place the remaining skiffs in two Iliamna Lake villages, neither of which has a permanent VPSO assignment.

There are currently 11 VPSOs in Bristol Bay, and Akelkok says she is hoping to fill a 12th position this year. She would like to add six more positions if the funding is provided.

"We've got a great team of VPSOs in this region that really work well together and

with the other local authorities," she said,

As for picking out the right boat for the job, Akelkok says she took valuable input from the men and women on the ground who will use them.

"Several VPSOs helped us decide what kind of boat would suit us best across the board, and I think we've settled on a great setup that will last for decades, hopefully."

# AFN convention expected to bring \$6 million for Anchorage merchants

The Alaska Federation of Natives' annual convention will descend on Anchorage in six weeks, and the annual gothering of 4,000 to 5,000 delegates is expected to net the city and its businesses more than \$6 million, according to AFN co-chair Tara Sweeney.

Sweeney discussed the upcoming convention at the weekly "Make it Monday" forum sponsored by the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce.

From humble beginnings in 1966, when 400 Alaska Natives gathered in Fairbanks to discuss land rights before the passage of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, the convention has grown to host thousands of attendees annually. It is the largest single convention in Alaska and, according to Sweeney, the largest representative annual gathering of any Native peoples in the U.S. Its economic and cultural effects loom large for its host city. Sweeney said that only Anchorage and Fairbanks are large enough to host the conference. Both cities lobby hard to bring the AFN convention – where delegates meet to set policy guidelines and advocacy statements by passing resolutions – to their respective convention venues. Open to the public as well, the AFN convention has influence beyond mere dollars for the host town, also representing a major cultural event.

The AFN convention will be Oct. 23 to 25

at the Dena'ina Center in downtown Anchorage. It will be in Anchorage again nextyear, with a planned move to Pairbanks in 2016. Sweeney said AFN board members would decide the location of the convention for following years in December.

"Anchorage and Fairbanks both compete fiercely to host the convention in their city," Sweeney said.

# ALASKA SCIENCE FORUM Maverick red aspens in a world of gold leaves

Sugary red pigment present in red and orange aspens, but not in vellow asbens

Will Lentz, a reader from Fairbanks, asks a question that flares every fall; why do some aspens turn red?

A few scientists from Fort Collins, Colo., pondered that subject in the late 1970s. Curious about red aspen trees people had noticed for half a century, they studied why these existed amid those with the more common leaf color, yellow.

Before getting to the scientists' results, a quick refresher on why tree leaves change color. Deciduous trees (the broad-leafed ones that drop their leaves in the fall, in contrast to our needle-leaved spruce) are gamblers now folding their hands after a few months of prosperity.

Sensing shorter periods of daylight, trees have quit refreshing their leaves with chlorophyll, the green pigment that helps capture the sun's energy and allows the tree to convert it to the sugars that make it taller and bushier

Right about now, when a tree reaches its daylight threshold, cork-like cells develop where leaf meets stem. This abscission layer, which later reveals itself as a handsome scar, is an ever-clogging pipeline that restricts the flow of sugars from leaf to tree. As the tree informs its solar panels their

services will no longer be needed, chlorophyll production stops. In mid-summer, chlorophyll was the loudest kid in the family. The parent tree replenished its leaves' chlorophyll as the sun faded them like colored paper left on the windowsill. The tree's autumn refusal to ante any more chlorophyll allows the quiel pigments in the leaf to express themselves

These include yellow (xanthophylls) and orange pigments (carotenoids). Reds and

purples come from anthocyanins. Kuo-Gin Chang, Gilbert Fechner and Herbert Schroeder, then at Colorado State University, a few decades ago dropped aspen leaves into a blender and pushed the button. From the solution of liquid leaves, they determined that a sugary red pigment was indeed present in red and orange aspens, but not in yellow aspens. The scientists hinted that the red occurs

on only some trees, meaning it is probably a genetic trait — a red aspen is sort of like a person with red hair. The researchers also vrote that yellow trees remained yellow from year to year but one tree they selected for its redness at the start of their five-year observation was red only for the first year and yellow each following year. And most of those lovely reds and orang-

es did not endure to carpet the forest floor, fading to bland yellow within a week of fall-

Another intriguing question: in this don't-waste-a-molecule world, why do trees invest in creating pigments other than ener-gy-gathering green? Nobody seems to have answered that, but scientists have speculated that red acts as a sunscreen to keep played-out leaves from getting overexcited by photons. Another idea is that color might also either throw off green-munching bugs or be a tree's way of showing insects its vigor compared to its drab, easy-to-attack neighbor.


