

WHAT YOU MUST DO Sort Your Garbage

Everyone is expected to
sort their garbage.

- Begin by setting up an area in your home or place of business and set aside your glass and cans.

- Recyclable materials accepted at various locations throughout town:

- Aluminum cans
- Ammunition
- Batteries - household, auto and boat
- Cleaned used motor oil
- Electronics
- Fishing nets
- Fluorescent Bulbs

LANDFILL HOURS

OPEN-Friday thru Tuesday
12PM-6PM

Closed-Wednesdays & Thursdays

- **Separate GLASS and CANS** from your other garbage.
- Place glass and cans in the designated bins located around town or deliver them to the landfill.
- Never throw fluorescent bulbs in your garbage! Never ever! Take them to the landfill.
- If Dillingham Refuse collects your garbage - glass and cans are accepted in your trash receptacles or in the dumpsters for pickup, but only on Days 1 - 7 of each month. The rest of the month, do not put glass or cans in your trash receptacles or in dumpsters.

SORT YOUR GARBAGE

SORT AND/OR RECYCLE	DELIVER TO	CHARGE
Aluminum cans	Landfill. Separate bins.	N/C (no charge)
Ammunition	Public Safety Building	N/C
Batteries	NAPA Store	N/C
Clean used motor oil	City Shop. Clean used motor oil <u>only</u> .	N/C
Electronics, including cellphones, TVs	Landfill	N/C
Fishing nets	Boat Harbor	N/C
Fluorescent bulbs	Landfill. DO NOT BREAK.	N/C
Refrigerators and freezers	Landfill. Landfill operators are certified to remove Freon.	Landfill charges
Scrap metal/appliances	Landfill	Landfill charges
Smoke alarms	Return to manufacturer	
Tires– remove rims	Landfill. Rims go with the scrap metal.	Landfill charges
Vehicles	Landfill. Remove all fluids.	Landfill charges

Physical inspection. Alaska Dept. of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) requires the City to educate the public on types of waste that can and cannot be disposed of at the Landfill. Landfill Operators will make random inspections of trash bags as authorized by ADEC.

Prohibited Wastes (Household Hazardous Waste and Other Wastes)

includes acids, corrosives, solvents, liquid wastes, oily wastes, grease, paint, sewage, explosives, drilling mud, unsterilized (infectious) medical wastes, fuel and radioactive wastes. Hazardous waste disposal can be coordinated through several companies.

VERY IMPORTANT!!

Some items are always compacted and buried in the landfill, like **GLASS**, **CANS**, and **METAL**. Melted glass, cans, and metal **damages** the incinerator.

Keeping up with the waste...

The City's incinerator burns a lot of waste, but to keep up with the waste flow, the City also compacts and buries its municipal waste, and openly burns paper, cardboard and clean wood.
