**Vacancies** – Police Officer selection has been made and is being processed. Only current opening is for Public Works Temporary Laborer.

Hired in May: Ben Dunaway, Heavy Equipment Mechanic  
Nicole Ito, Library Aide hired through BBEDC program  
Darrell Tilden, Water/Wastewater Operator I

Interns from the BBEDC program were interviewed for Planning, Public Works and the Port/Harbor and will be starting in June.

**Contracts/Agreements Signed** – Contract for Insurance Services is being processed for signature. Contracts for aggregate purchases and equipment services approved at the May 4<sup>th</sup> Council meeting will be executed as purchase orders.

**Landfill** – The City fish waste collection bin is located, unattended and unprotected, between Waskey Road and the Landfill entrance. This has become a feeding station for bears and an attractive nuisance for humans.

To better protect the safety of both people and the bears, we would like to relocate the bin across the road from the transfer station inside the landfill site and behind an electrified fence. So far though, we do not have a way to do this and still provide the 24hour access that the public has come to expect of this dumping facility. For now, we will be operating the fish waste disposal bin this summer at its usual location.

Also attached is a record of the landfill fees collected in May.

**Legislature** – Spoke with Rep. Edgmon's office and the City Lobbyist today for any latest updates on Legislative activity. Summary is that low-profile meetings are taking place throughout but there is nothing officially scheduled as of now to take action on the budget plan. Concern is toward avoiding a government shutdown but in the meanwhile the agencies have to make required notifications and employees may be receiving furlough notices. These are unprecedented actions and we remain concerned about the effect on such issues as fishing openers and other seasonal activity like construction.

**Fireworks Sales** – The City has inspected the site and approved the application of Billie Benedict to sell fireworks from June 10<sup>th</sup> through July 7<sup>th</sup>. The site location is in the industrial area across the street from the City water tower. (243 C Street, Dillingham).

**Grants** – BBEDC Infrastructure Grant submitted and letter received that the application was complete. We are requesting approximately \$861,000 that will be used for paving Seward and D Street along with addressing the water lines under the streets when uncovered. BBEDC Board is considering these projects in a meeting being held today (June 1, 2017)
