RESOLUTION NO. 2013-27

A RESOLUTION OF THE DILLINGHAM CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) GRANT FOR A NEW FIRE TRUCK

WHEREAS, the City of Dillingham's Fire Department utilized BBEDC's grant writing assistant program for a new fire truck; and

WHEREAS, BBEDC contracts with Agnew:Beck for the grant writing assistance; and

WHEREAS, Agnew:Beck put together an application with the Fire Department staff with a program under FEMA and the Department of Homeland Security under the Assistance to Firefighters Grant program in September 2011 which was not originally funded and was resubmitted with a few edits in 2012; and

WHEREAS, under the FY 2012 Assistance to Firefighters Grant the Fire Departments grant application was re-submitted and approved on April 25, 2013 for a total project cost of \$405,000; and

WHEREAS, the Federal share is 95% or \$384,750 of the approved amount and our share of the costs is 5% or \$20,250; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Department Ambulance Fund has sufficient funds for the 5% match and the match will be budgeted in FY 14 to complete the purchase; and

WHEREAS, the funds received from this grant will be replacing a 1962 Ford F600 Tanker which is a converted fuel tanker with a new fuel efficient 4WD tanker with a 3000 gallon water tank, auto rear chains, 30 gallon foam tank and a winterization package at a cost of approximately \$370,000; and

WHEREAS, the remaining project funds will be used for equipment to outfit the new tanker; travel for two department representatives to inspect the vehicle; contract for State Emergency Driver Certification program in Dillingham and to send a couple of senior driver/operators to Anchorage to become certified emergency driver instructors.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. the City of Dillingham authorizes the City Manager to accept the grant;
2. start the process with the Fire Department for purchasing a new fully equipped Tanker to be shipped to Dillingham in the spring of 2014 utilizing our procurement policy; and
3. contract with the State for Emergency Driver Certification training.



Summary Statement. A FEMA grant was submitted and funded in April 2013 for a total amount of \$405,000. The grant is to replace a 1962 Ford F600 Tanker with a fully equipped new fuel efficient 4WD tanker with a 3000 gallon water tank, auto rear chains, 30 gallon foam truck and a winterization package.

There is a 5% match for the grant which amounts to \$20,250. This will be taken from the Fire Department Ambulance Fund.

Once approved by the City Council the City Manager will work with the Fire Department to start the process, following our procurement policy, to purchase the equipment and to comply with all grant regulations.
